# MACKENZIE US SMALL-MID CAP GROWTH FUND

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## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 12, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investors holding securities of Mackenzie US Small-Mid Cap Growth Class were merged into the corresponding series of the Fund on a tax-deferred basis on July 30, 2021. Consequently the information in this report is presented as if the Fund had existed since the inception of Mackenzie US Small-Mid Cap Growth Class.

## Results of Operations

### Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A and Series LB securities returned 3.1% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 10.3% for the Fund's broad-based index, the S&P 500 Index, and a return of 4.0% for the Fund's narrow index, the Russell 2500 Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Despite volatility, U.S. equities performed strongly over the period, driven by the information technology and communication services sectors. Market enthusiasm about artificial intelligence continued to propel related companies, bolstered by positive earnings reports and optimistic outlooks. Moreover, the U.S. Federal Reserve cut its federal funds rate by 50 basis points, signalling its commitment to fostering economic growth. Defensive sectors, such as consumer staples and health care, lagged as fears of recession eased.

U.S. small- and mid-capitalization stocks generally underperformed large-capitalization stocks. Within the Russell 2500 Index, utilities, real estate and communication services were the best-performing sectors in Canadian dollar terms, while energy, information technology and consumer discretionary were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed both the broad-based index and the narrow index, with stock selection in the health care, consumer staples and real estate sectors detracting from performance. Conversely, stock selection in the industrials sector contributed to performance relative to both indices. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

Relative to the narrow index, stock selection in the information technology sector also contributed to performance.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

### Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Integration

During the period, the Fund initiated a position in Exact Sciences Corp., a health care company that manufactures products with a positive social impact, namely, diagnostic tools for the early detection of colorectal cancer, such as Cologuard. Furthermore, Exact Sciences' dedication to advancing medical technology and accessibility aligns with the portfolio management team's ESG strategy.

### Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 5.3% during the period to \$2.9 billion. This change was composed primarily of \$100.0 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$262.2 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

### Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2024, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

### Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes that the performance of U.S. small- and mid-cap equities during the period stemmed from market confidence that lower interest rates would benefit smaller companies. However, if lower interest rates are the consequence of a slowing economy, the outlook for smaller companies may be less positive. Markets appeared to become more concerned about the possibility of an economic slowdown in early August 2024 after weak employment statistics were released. In the team's view, the markets remained optimistic that the U.S. Federal Reserve can orchestrate a "soft landing" and avoid a recession.

At period-end, the Fund maintained exposure to companies that are less sensitive to the economic cycle in sectors such as health care, information technology and industrials.

The following changes to the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee occurred:

- effective September 13, 2023, Saijal Patel was appointed;
- effective March 5, 2024, Atul Tiwari resigned; and
- effective April 30, 2024, the terms for Robert Hines and George Hucal expired, and Rebecca Cowdery was appointed.

### Related Party Transactions

#### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

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## Other Related Party Transactions

At September 30, 2024, Mackenzie had an investment of \$1.3 million in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

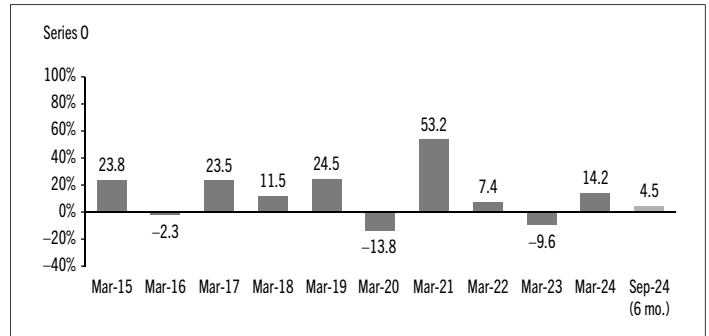
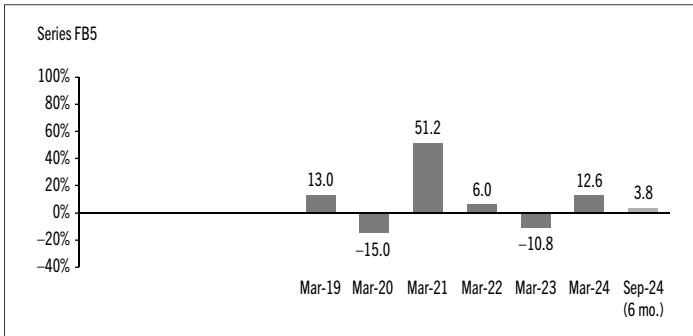
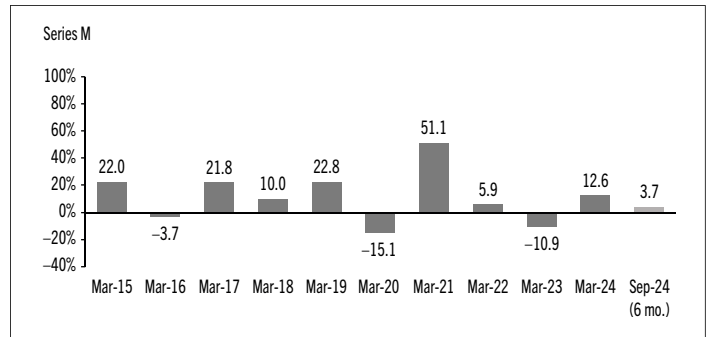
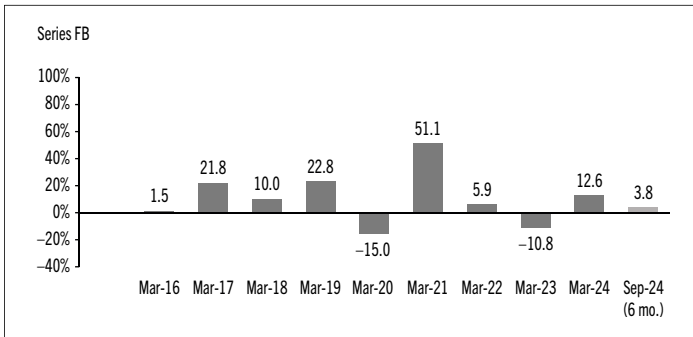
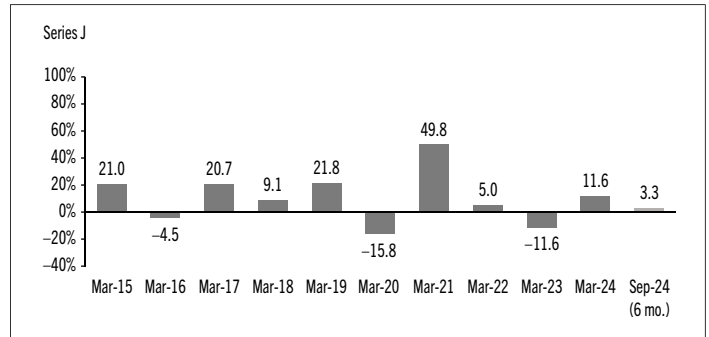
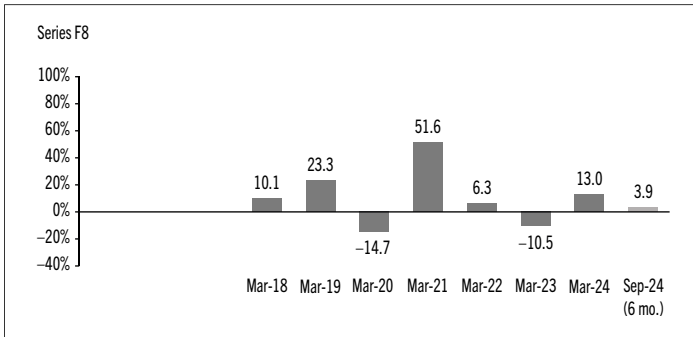
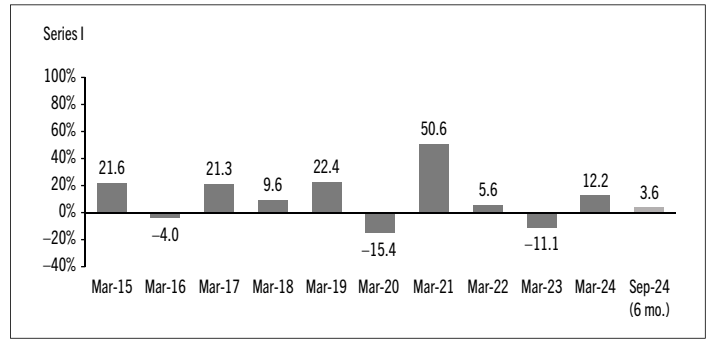
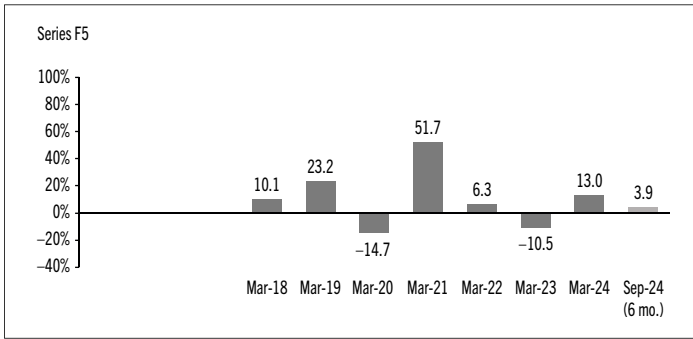
## Year-by-Year Returns

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## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 25% of the total management fees that the Manager received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the period. The Manager is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: Investors Group Securities Inc. and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 32% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.
